In order to return to racing, South Boston Speedway has instituted certain policies due to government mandates related to the COVID-19 pandemic. We ask that you please help keep the green flag in the air by working with us to follow these mandates.

South Boston Speedway has also implemented an array of mitigation methods throughout the facility, which includes deploying additional hand-sanitizing stations, enhancing sanitation of high-traffic areas, limiting capacity and introducing contactless ticketing options.

Before leaving home:

- Consult health guidelines and regulations from the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC), US federal government, Commonwealth of Virginia and Halifax County.
- Take the temperature of all persons in your party. If anyone has a fever of 100.4°F or higher, please keep them and your entire party home.
- Stay home if you -- or anyone in your party -- is experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms. Consider staying home if you are in a higher risk category, or care for someone who is.
- Stay home if you have been in contact with someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 10 days.

At the track:

- Face coverings that fully cover the nose and mouth are required at all times.
- You may be health screened via questionnaire and temperature check.
- Comply with social distancing of at least 6' with those outside of your party all throughout the facility.
 - Avoid congregating in groups outside of your immediate race team
 - Victory Lane celebrations should be with crew only; individuals from grandstands are not permitted
- Wash your hands frequently using soap and water. If soap and water aren't available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

 - Avoid congregating in groups outside of your party at common areas (ticket gates, concession stands, restrooms, etc.)
 - Sit only with people in your party in the grandstands/sitting areas.
- Wash your hands frequently using soap and water. If soap and water aren't available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

Before entering the facility, please make sure that you have not had any of the following in the last 10 days.

- Fever greater than 100.4°F or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- Come in contact with someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19
